HOW TO INSTALL YOUR FONT
You will receive your files as a zipped folder.
For instructions on how to unzip your folder, visit LauraWorthingtonType.com/faqs/.
Your font is available in two formats: TrueType Font file (.ttf) and OpenType Font file (.otf).
If you have a Mac® ${ }^{\circledR}$ or newer Windows ${ }^{\circledR}$ computer, install the .otf file(s). If you have an older Windows computer, install the .ttf files. Install the font by double-clicking on the .ttf or .otf file. When the popup menu appears, click on Install font (Mac) or Install (Windows). Fonts may also be installed by dragging and dropping them into your system's font folder.
After installing your font, save a copy of the downloaded font files in a folder on your computer as a resource in case you want to re-install the font or transfer it to a new computer.

## HOW TO INSERT SWASHES,

ALTERNATES, AND ORNAMENTS
Some programs have a glyphs or symbol panel where the complete font including swashes and ornaments can be accessed and inserted directly. For programs that do not have a way to directly insert the swashes, the easiest method of putting in alternate swashes or symbols is by using either Character Map (Windows) or FontBook (Mac).

## Character Map (Windows)

Character Map is a standard Windows utility and can be found in the Start Menu's accessories folder (Windows XP, Vista, 7) or in All Apps under Windows Accessories (Windows 8.1, 1O). Character Map can also be found by searching for it by name.

Select your font from the drop-down menu. Character Map will show all available glyphs. To quickly find the swashes, change Group By to Unicode Subrange, and select Private Use Characters from the pop-up menu. Click on any swash and then copy and paste it into your document.

## FontBook (Mac)

Font Book is a standard Mac utility program and can be found in Finder under the Go menu under Applications. Once FontBook is open, go to the View menu and select Repertoire. Click on User in the left panel and then select the font name to see all available swashes in the font. Click on any swash and then copy and paste it into your document.

## Voltage

Voltage, created by award-winning typeface and lettering designer Laura Worthington, is an unexpected and energetic standout in the world of script fonts, breaking free from formal classifications while retaining the degree of personality we treasure in Fard lettering.

Her primary goal was unique: readability with personality. Gone are the large loops, the frilliness, and the choice of beauty and elegance ower utility.

Voltage takes the script font in a different direction, with an emphasis on practicality and uniformity, and with the reader's needs at the forefrant-this is a straightforward, muscular lettering font, assertive, yet down-to-earth. The beauty is found in its elegantly-urought construction, its versatility, its references to a different era, and in the galwanizing swashes and alternates awailable not anly in a professianal designer's saftware, but to everyane with a computer.

It is not based an naturally-accurring handuriting; it's clearly a structured lettering form based on balance,
a solid rhythm, and uniformity. Script fonts often are quirky. In contrast, this is a workhorse, almost a text wersian of a script font. Valtage is ideal for headlines, logos, subheads, short sentences, phrases, a short paragraph, and pull quotes. The default setting (without swashes and alternates) is best for phrases and subheads.

## Like many of Worthington's typefaces, Voltage is

enacative of a milieu or era. Here, we see the metal lettering on autamabiles of the past-with their retro takes on a bright future-and thase emblems of an optimistic, hardworking period. Its overall regularity references a time when the machine was king-the late days of the Industrial Age. Imagine uintage instructions on signs or paper; they may be created by machinery or by hand, yet both have that industrial sensibility. We sense uisions in the 1950s-
and earlier-of what the Nuclear Age would look like. Voltage calls to mind gas stations, machinists, receipts at machine shops, trips to the soda fountain at the drugstore, shopping at the five and dime. Yet, in its twists and small irregularities, we see uestiges of hand-painted signage, the rivets in beloued, old, worn blue jeans, the touch of the "common man" who, alangside women, built America.

Valtage is wersatile. Like thase ald jeans, the look depends on how and where you use it. You can dress up a good pair of jeans by choosing high heels; you can dress down with sturdy work boats. Because Worthingtan assigned unicode walues to the swashes and alternates, anyone can use their operating system's Character Map to access them. The options become endless. It can hawe the spirit of a picniccasual, fun, and friendly, yet, in other contexts, convey tough
mountain-biking. So, use this font for small areas of text and it makes a statement without ouerpowering the main body text. Or, dig into Voltage swashes and alternates for much larger tittes to capture the attention of the reader and create a dramatic presence, such as using the powerful lightning bolt swash that shoots out from the descender of the lowercase g. Electrifying!

The challenge, as Worthington worked on Voltage, was noting that script fonts are almost always notoriously difficult to read. How could she strive for clarity, readability, and uniformity, yet retain the uivid personality that Voltage (and its designers and readers) deserwe? She used a tall $x$-height, minimal detailing in the lowercase ascenders and descenders, warked on low contrast, and amped it up to make it heawier and add substance. It comes in 3 weights-
light, regular, and bold-and euen the regular weight is as substantial as many bolds in ather fonts. In fact, it is one of the few script fonts that you can use with confidence at a relatively small size (e.g., 18 pt) in a short paragraph. No ane letter dominates the athers. Stems have a weighty base but have light strakes in many letters for clarity and distinctiveness. The looped descenders of the lowercase $g$ and ather letters use a thin strake that curwes and thickens as it rises up to meet the next letter, making the loop lighter and therefore more legible than a large uniform loop.
This mast magnetic typeface prowides 154 unique swash designs (that yield a total of 348 swash wariations), 39 alternates, and 15 ligatures. *
